Journey North is a web-based science program that provides sets of investigations that encourage students to explore the concept of seasonal change. Students become involved in a global study of wildlife migration and the changing seasons. As spring sweeps across the Northern Hemisphere, and the intricate relationships between living things unfold, students witness the drama from a unique perspective.

In addition to following migrations, students observe the local emergence of spring through studies of changing daylight, temperature and other signs of spring. Together, students gather, organize and analyze their own data. Using the Internet, they can fit their local observations into a global context-essentially seeing that their small part of the world is part of a large, natural system.

Turn right out of toll- booth to Rt. 96
intersection (traffic signal). Turn left onto Rt.

96. Go to traffic light at intersection of Rts. 96 and 88 in Phelps, turn north (left). Proceed north on Rt. 88 and follow it into



the village of Newark. At East Maple Avenue, turn right (traffic signal). (On this corner, there is a convenience store and a liquor store.) Proceed east on Maple Avenue. After you pass a ball field on your left, you will go up a hill. You will see post signs on your right for BOCES Edutech Receiving, and then at the top, a large, lighted yard sign for the Regional Support Center. Turn right into one-way, circular drive.

**From Interstate 90 West (190)**: Exit 42 - Lyons, Rt. 14: Take Rt. 14 north to Rt. 31 in Lyons. (Four-way traffic signal.) Turn left (west) onto Rt. 31. Travel past Wal-Mart and P&C Market (on left) to a four-way traffic light just beyond Sunoco gas station. Turn left onto Vienna Street. Go to a flashing red light at East Maple Avenue and turn right. (BE CAREFUL - Cross traffic does not stop.) At top of hill, on your left, is a large yard sign for the Regional Support Center. Just beyond it, turn left into a one-way drive.

**From Rt. 96**: Turn north on Rt. 88 in Phelps. Proceed north on Rt. 88 and follow it into the village of Newark. At East Maple Avenue, turn right (traffic signal). (There will be a convenience store and a liquor store to your left.) Proceed east on Maple Avenue. After you pass a ball field on your left, you will go up a hill. You will see post signs on your right for BOCES Edutech Receiving, and then, at the top, a large, lighted yard sign for the Regional Support Center. Turn right into one-way, circular drive.

From Route 31: Traveling west from Lyons, pass Wal-Mart and P&C Foods plazas. At the Sunoco gas station (on right), road bends to right; prepare to turn left at upcoming traffic light - Vienna Street. Proceed on Vienna to flashing stoplight at East Maple Avenue. (Be careful at this intersection. Cross traffic does not stop!) Turn right, go up hill. On your left is a large, lighted Regional Support Center yard sign - pass it and immediately turn left into one-way, circular drive. Traveling east from Palmyra, turn right (South) onto Route 88. (This is Newark's main intersection. A movie theater is on the right, The Corner restaurant on the left) proceed south to third traffic signal - East Maple Avenue. (A convenience store will be on the right.) Turn left onto East Maple. Proceed east on Maple Avenue. After you pass a ball field on your left, you will go up a hill. You will see post signs on your right for BOCES Edutech Receiving, and then, at the top, a large, lighted yard sign for the Regional Support Center. Turn right into one-way, circular drive.

**PARKING**: A parking area will be on your left as you enter the circular drive. The far half is BOCES parking. Each of the three buildings is identified by a yard sign and a sign over the main doorway. If the far side of this lot is full, proceed around the circle to an intersecting road and turn right. After passing under an enclosed walkway, you will see more BOCES parking spaces in lots on your left behind the Eisenhower Building. There is also disabled parking on the circle. For security purposes, you must enter the buildings by their front doors.

#### Q: "How do I register for a workshop?"

**A:** Send in the registration form, which is on the following page and on our website, to the indicated address or fax number. A printed confirmation will be sent to you. Phone registrations cannot be accepted. Registrations will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

**Deadline for registrations is two weeks prior to a scheduled workshop.** The registration form MUST be signed by your APPROVING ADMINISTRATOR. All information regarding registration is included on this form and on the Internet at www.edutech.org/training.cfm. If you need a form and/or other information, please call 585-394-9239, Ext. 1044.

### Q: "What should I do if I don't receive a confirmation?"

**A:** Call us at least three days before your scheduled workshop. Do not attend a workshop if you have not confirmed your registration.

### Q: "What happens if I am registered for a workshop but I cannot attend?"

**A:** Cancellations may be made by calling 585-394-9239 Ext. 1044, or e-mail rmortensen@wflboces.org. Please cancel as soon as possible to allow us ample time to fill the class from our waiting list.

#### Q: "Are workshops ever canceled or postponed?"

**A:** If we do not receive a minimum of three registrations for a course by the registration deadline, the course will be canceled. Sometimes classes will be postponed due to extenuating circumstances. It may be necessary to cancel participation in a given workshop due to schedule conflicts, etc. Your district will not be charged if there is a 14 day notice of cancellation and the cancellation does not adversely impact another district by raising costs or diminishing the quality of the workshop. When a consultant is contracted with to provide a workshop and the district cancels its registration, we must honor the contract while not asking the remaining districts to pay a higher price than originally given. We will make every attempt to give timely notification to all participants affected by a cancellation. When weather is a factor: Workshops will be canceled only when the district in which the training site is located closes due to WEATHER RELATED conditions.

**Example**: If the LeRoy School District closes because of weather, workshops at the LeRoy lab will be canceled. School delays do not affect the workshop-starting time. If inclement weather is forecast, please listen to your radio for school closing information, and, above all, use your best judgment about whether you should attempt to attend.

#### Q: "What time do workshops start?"

**A:** Most workshops run from 8:30 a.m.- 2:30 p.m. with an hour break for lunch, unless otherwise noted. All workshops will begin **promptly**.

#### Q: "What about lunch?"

**A:** Our training sites are located in proximity to several restaurants. Your workshop trainer can guide you to local dining areas, or bring a bag lunch and eat right on site.

#### Q: "How should I dress?"

**A:** We suggest that you dress in comfortable, casual clothes. It may be helpful to dress in layers, since room temperatures are sometimes unpredictable.

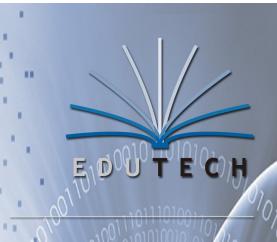
