Senior Privilege Requirements

What are Senior Privileges? - Seniors with privileges do not need to report to study halls, but must sign out in the Reception Office so that we may keep track of the students' whereabouts. Upon returning to school, seniors must sign back in at the Reception Office. You must do this yourself. You cannot have somebody else sign you in or out.

Seniors who have a first period study hall MUST sign out in the Reception Office the day before. Failure to follow this procedure will result in the loss of privileges.

Seniors who sign out must leave the school building and remain off of the school grounds until they sign back in. If a senior chooses to stay in the building during their study hall, they must be in their assigned study hall. There will be no loitering in the halls or the main foyer.

Grades - Any senior applying for privileges must have maintained an average of 75% in each course at the end of the 2nd quarter. (1st, 2nd marking period and midterm/finals averaged and cannot be failing any class or have an incomplete in order to be eligible. Students will have two opportunities to earn privileges—end of the 2nd marking period and end of the 3rd marking period.

Attendance and Tardiness - With the exception of some extreme cases (long sicknesses, hospitalization, etc.) a student cannot be absent and/or tardy more than ten (10) times during the school year. If a student is absent and/or tardy more than ten (10) times, he or she is not eligible for senior privileges. If a student is truant he/she will lose senior privileges and be subject to disciplinary consequences.

Behavior - A student is not eligible for senior privileges if he or she is assigned In-School Suspension (ISS) or Out-of-School Suspension (OSS) at any time during the year. If he or she receives ISS or OSS while they have privileges, the privileges will be revoked.

To support good behavior, the student will need to have four (4) separate and current teachers sign a character reference sheet that will state that each teacher will support the idea of that student having senior privileges. These signatures need to remain on the sheet for the entire fourth marking period in order to keep privileges. A teacher may revoke their name as a character reference at any time during this marking period. If this happens, the student will lose his or her privileges. Also, any teacher, character reference or not, can have privileges revoked with good reason.

What Happens If you Lose Your Privileges? - If a student loses his or her privileges at any time during the final marking period, they are not eligible to get them back. There

will be no reconsideration of giving privileges back once they are gone. If this happens, the student must attend classes as assigned, just like the first twenty (20) weeks.

Parental Consent - Any senior who is eligible to receive senior privileges must have his or her parent's or guardian's approval.
