

\$ 221,827 of Foundation Aid Increase must be used for High-Impact Tutoring. \$ 100,000 must also be used for Community Schools purposes.

High-Impact Tutoring Programs

- \$250 million of Foundation Aid increase would be set-aside for this initiative
- Focus on Reading/Math in grades 3-8

2023 - 24 SALARIES

\$ 7,239,789 \$ 981,913 Increase

Certified Employees - Teachers, Teacher Assistants, Counselors, Psychologists, Administrators, Nurses, Coaches, Extracurricular Stipends, Substitutes

\$ 4,045,312 \$ 469,577 Increase

Non-Certified Employees - Teacher Aides, Clerical, Custodians, Cleaner, Directors, Bus Drivers, Bus Monitors, Substitutes

Note: This salary budget assumes all active employees will return in combination with potentially adding School Resource Officer, UPK Teacher(s), Transportation runs, Bus Drivers and Monitors, Head Custodian, Music Teacher and Language Teacher positions.

BENEFITS

 Benefits consists of mandatory district contributions to health insurance, retirement systems (ERS & TRS), social security, unemployment and worker's compensation insurance
